

### **Important Note**

*Text below is for guidance only, the current edition of the IATA DGR Manual is the official reference for the acceptance of such items.*

- 1. Personal Movement Devices (PMD)** Lithium battery powered PMDs (e.g. Air wheel, Solo wheel, Hoverboard, Mini-Segway and Balance wheel).  
**Exceptions:** Nil.
- 2. Petrol powered equipment.**  
**Exceptions:** Only if completely drained from liquid fuel / fuel vapors and danger nullified using approved processes as laid down in IATA DGR Manual.
- 3. Pressured cylinders.**  
**Exceptions:** Only when fully depressurized, manometer reads zero.
- 4. Ammunition.**  
**Exceptions:** Only for cartridges / blank for small arms, when securely packed, for personal use and not exceeding 5Kgs gross per person.
- 5. Flammable liquid and solids.**  
**Exceptions:** Nil
- 6. Paints.**  
**Exceptions:** Only for water based paints that are adequately packed.
- 7. Lithium Powered items**  
**Exceptions:** Only rechargeable Lithium and Lithium polymer batteries not exceeding 100 watt hours and with a Lithium metal content not exceeding 2g per battery. Larger batteries require Airline approval. Spare batteries are not allowed in hold baggage.
- 8. Fire Crackers.**  
**Exceptions:** Nil
- 9. Drones.**  
**Exceptions:** Battery restrictions apply, contact airline.
- 10. E-cigarettes.**  
**Exceptions:** Only allowed in hand baggage.
- 11. Hair Curlers containing gas/hydrocarbons.**  
**Exceptions:** Only one per passenger, with safety cover securely fitted over heating element. Gas refills are not allowed.
- 12. Heat producing articles.**  
**Exceptions:** Only when heat producing components are removed (battery, bulbs or fuse). Battery must be protected from short circuit by taping exposed terminals and battery placed in separate plastic bag.
